Approval of Agenda The agenda was approved as presented. & Meeting Summary The April 2017 summary was approved as presented with one abstention. **ECAC Report** May 2017 ECAC Report Cynthia Conteas-Wood, Chair, reported on the following: • A grant of up to \$500,000 was approved for the Martin Luther King Jr. Community Health Foundation. L.A. Care is providing funding for the initial operational phase of the advanced care clinic located in South Los Angeles. Francisco Oaxaca, Senior Director of Communications and Community Relations, informed the committee that Government Affairs and the CO&E/CCI team are planning for local legislative office visits in the summer. o RCAC/CCI Council members will be advocating on behalf of L.A. Care for the "AB 1092- Restoration of Adult Vision Benefits". The ECAC Ad-Hoc Committee – Vision Benefits made the following recommendations to ECAC: o. The Ad-Hoc Committee members agreed that the recommendation made will be for Medi-Cal consumers 18-64 years of age who have minimal vision coverage. o Short term advocacy recommendations include the following:

- Work with Government Affairs Department to organize legislative office visits and create talking points to continue supporting AB 1092.
- Participate in community events to speak about vision issues and educate the community on its impact.
- Add regular updates on AB 1092 status to advisory committee members.
- Long Term advocacy includes the following:
- Petition to the Board of Governors to host an eye clinic event similar to Care Harbor for the underserved population of L.A. County.
- Long Term Community Engagement includes the following:
- Make a recommendation to the Board of Governors to approve a grant funding program for vision providers.
- ECAC committee approved the Ad-Hoc committee recommendations and will be forwarded to internal department for follow-up and next steps.

#### June 2017 ECAC Report

Roberto Santos gave a report on the following:

- A member suggested that the Health Promoter program needs to be strengthened.
- L.A. Care has received 25 applications from clinics for funding for accessible exam equipment.

Cynthia provided additional information from the June ECAC meeting:

- The Antelope Valley Family Resource Center opened on June 16, 2017.
- L.A. Care's new Chief Medical Officer (CMO) is Dr. Richard Siedman.
- L.A. Care now has 2,120,000 members.

## May 2017 Board of Governors (BOG) Meeting Report

- L.A. Care now has 2 million members.
- Many senior need financial help for their medical services.

• A grant was awarded to the Martin Luther King Hospital for services for the homeless population. Maggie asked the Board if this award was a one-time \$500,000 grant or a 3-year contract totaling \$1.5 million.
