	 Beginning on January 1, 2018, adult Medi-Cal recipients will have access to full dental services. This restoration of benefits will cover gum treatments, rear root canals and partial dentures. Currently, adult Medi-Cal recipients only receive some dental services. Beginning January 1, 2020, adult vision services will be fully restored for adult Medi-Cal recipients to include frames and lenses. Currently, only the eye exam is a Medi-Cal benefit.
