		• Generaciones en Accion's vision is to unite different generations of immigrants through communication, understanding, validation and mutual respect within the family and the community.
		• The mission is to help multi-generational immigrant families and organizations gain access to education, trainings and cultural activities that contribute to their personal well-being, professional development, leadership skills and community impact.
		• Generaciones en Accion will utilize L.A. Care funding to organize a seminar with different workshops for women's health improvement and self-improvement to become better advocates in their communities.
