Important Questions	Answers	Why This Matters:
What is the overall deductible?	<b>\$4,000 individual / \$8,000family.</b> Per calendar year	Generally, you must pay all of the costs from providers up to the <u>deductible</u> amount before this <u>plan</u> begins to pay. If you have other family members on the <u>plan</u> , each family member must meet their own individual <u>deductible</u> until the total amount of <u>deductible</u> expenses paid by all family members meets the overall family <u>deductible</u> .
Are there services covered before you meet your deductible?	Family, physician, and specialist office visits, preventive care, and other services not subject to deductible.	This <u>plan</u> covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the <u>deductible</u> amount, but a <u>copayment</u> or <u>coinsurance</u> may apply.
Are there other deductibles for specific services?	\$300 individual or \$600 family for prescription drug coverage. There are no other specific deductibles.	You must pay all of the costs for these services up to the specific <u>deductible</u> amount before this <u>plan</u> begins to pay for these services.
What is the <u>out-of-pocket</u> <u>limit</u> for this <u>plan</u> ?	For participating providers \$7,800 individual or \$15,600 family.  Per calendar year	The <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> is the most you could pay in a year for covered services. If you have other family members in this <u>plan</u> , they have to meet their own <u>out-of-pocket limits</u> until the overall family <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> has been met.
What is not included in the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> ?	Premiums and health care this plan doesn't cover.	Even though you pay these expenses, they don't count toward the out-of-pocket limit.
Will you pay less if you use a <u>network provider</u> ?	Yes. See lacare.lacare.org or call 1-855-270-2327 (TTY 711) for a list of participating providers.	This <u>plan</u> uses a provider <u>network</u> . You will pay less if you use a participating <u>provider</u> in the plan's <u>network</u> . You will pay the most if you use an <u>non-participating provider</u> , and you might receive a bill from a <u>provider</u> for the difference between the provider's charge and what your <u>plan</u> pays ( <u>balance billing</u> ). Be aware, your <u>participating provider</u> might use a <u>non-participating provider</u> for some services (such as lab work). Check with your <u>provider</u> before you get services.
Do you need a <u>referral</u> to see a <u>specialist</u> ?	Yes. Your Primary Care Physician (PCP) needs to refer you.	This <u>plan</u> will pay some or all of the costs to see a <u>specialist</u> for covered services but only if you have a <u>referral</u> before you see the <u>specialist</u> .

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Your Rights to Continue Coverage: Federal and State laws may provide protections that allow you to keep health this coverage as long as you pay your premium. There are exceptions, however, such as if:

- You commit Fraud
- The insurer stops offering services in the State
- You move outside the coverage area

# Does this plan provide Minimum Essential Coverage? Yes

If you don't have Minimum Essential Coverage for a month, you'll have to make a payment when you file your tax return unless you qualify for an exemption from the requirement that you have health coverage for that month.

## Does this plan meet the Minimum Value Standards? Yes

If your <u>plan</u> doesn't meet the <u>Minimum Value Standards</u>, you may be eligible for a <u>premium tax credit</u> to help you pay for a <u>plan</u> through Covered California.

**This is not a cost estimator.** Treatments shown are just examples of how this <u>plan</u> might cover medical care. Your actual costs will be different depending on the actual care you receive, the prices your <u>providers</u> charge, and many other factors.
