MEETING SUMMARY, DISCUSSION AND FOLLOW UP

AGENDA ITEM LEAD WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS Estela Lara, Chair I. Manny Vizcarra has transitioned to the Family Resource Center in Pomona. Ismael Maldonado read the Ground Rules. Kristina Chung, *Field Specialist*, reviewed the agenda with the members. **BUSINESS** Kristina Chung, Field Specialist II. - Ms. Cooper stated the decision to offer members gift cards for completion of the work plan project was not approved by the RCACs or ECAC. Janet Henderson stated that this is not right and was not explained to the RCACs. Idalia De La Torre, *Supervisor,* explained that this change was brought forth at the June meeting. The gift card is a thank you to members who have completed the work plan project.
 - Ms. Chung clarified that the main role of the RCACs is to advise and provide recommendation on healthcare issues affecting members. This does not include making decisions on policies, work plans or administration. Ms. Chung advised Ms. Cooper that she can contact Francisco Oaxaca, *Senior Director*, if she would like to discuss this further.
- The summary was motioned for approval by Mary Jo Fernandez and seconded by Gary Stein. The summary was approved with 2 nays.

ECAC and Board of Governors (BOG) Reports

• Members received a copy of the ECAC report to review. Members who attended the ECAC and Board of Governors (BOG) meetings gave a report on the following:

July 2019 ECAC Report (Maria Ramos)

- Priti Thanki from Government Affairs talked about the Medi-Cal expansion that would make undocumented residents between 19-25 eligible for Medi-Cal. The expansion will take effect on January 1, 2020 and is expected to affect 90,000 residents.
- Also on January 1, 2020, Medi-Cal will reinstate optometry, podiatry and speech therapy.
- Post-partum services will be extended from 60 days to a year.

• Ms. Cooper requested details from the Public Comment Section of the ECAC meeting. Ms. Chung will ask Board Services for the ECAC minutes to be forwarded to Ms. Cooper.

July 2019 BOG Report (Maricruz Alvarez)

- John Baackes, *Chief Executive Officer (CEO)*, stated that L.A. Care has 2.7 million members.
- The *Elevating the Safety Net* Program has selected a new group of medical students this year.

Emergency Preparedness Training

Stress Management Presentation

- Torhon Barnes from the Safety Net Initiatives Department presented on coping mechanisms to deal with stress.
- Ms. Cooper stated that cultural factors play an important role in stress and this should be a focus of the Behavioral Health Department.
- Ms. Henderson stated that Kaiser prescribes antidepressants for problems sleeping. Mr. Barnes said that she can seek assistance at County facilities and have services transferred.
