RE: REMINDER: Fire Recovery Resources and Support Event for L.A. Care Providers and Staff

Dear Healthcare Partners,

The devastating Palisades and Eaton fires have significantly impacted our community, destroying nearly 50,000 acres and 15,000 structures while severely disrupting essential services including healthcare delivery and infrastructure. The Los Angeles County Medical Association (LACMA) reports that hundreds of healthcare professionals, including physicians, advanced practice clinicians, and their staff, have been displaced by these disasters.

To support our medical community, LACMA has developed a comprehensive online resource toolkit (ladocs.org), available to both LACMA members and non-members. This toolkit provides essential information on practice rebuilding, sustainability strategies, patient communications, and additional recovery resources.

The event is completely free, including parking, childcare, food, and beverages.
